Using Liquid Nitrogen

Let's stay safe at work!

Know the risks

- Extremely cold → cryogenic burns.
- Gas expansion → less oxygen → asphyxiation risk.
- Can **explode** if in improper or sealed containers, or when exposed to heat.

Work safely

- Use only cryogenic-rated containers with pressure release valves.
- Never store it in sealed containers.
- Store and use only in well-ventilated areas.
- Never handle with bare hands.
- Wear cryogenic gloves for dispensing.
- Always wear eye protection or a face shield.
- Dispense below waist height.
- Let unused liquid nitrogen evaporate in ventilated areas.

First aid for liquid nitrogen exposure

- Skin: Do not rub. Rinse with lukewarm water.
- **Eyes**: Rinse with water immediately, remove contact lenses if present, and flush for 15 minutes (use an eyewash station when possible).
- **Inhalation**: Move to fresh air. Keep the area of the spill ventilated (e.g., door open).
